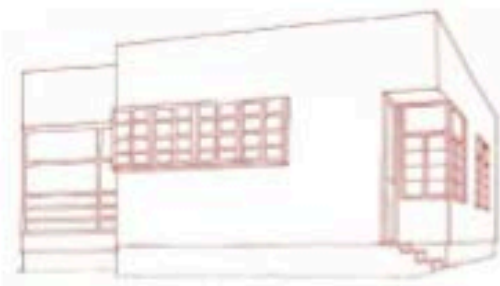

1. Carlsbad, California; 2005. Examples with twisted columns and rounded towers have Spanish roots.
3. Dallas, Texas; 2001. New Mediterranean houses with an added squared tower, as seen here, are often called "Tuscan."
3. Dallas, Texas; 1996. Richardson Robertson III, architect. Note the raised terrace and the heavy squared tower.
4. San Antonio, Texas; 2000. Daniell House; Michael G. Imber, architect. This house is sited on a front motor court with a large fountain in the center.
5. Highland Park, Texas; 2011–2012. An unusually shaped corner lot facilitated this rambling shape.
6. Dallas, Texas; 2010. Larry Boerder, architect.
7. Carlsbad, California; 1989. The developer also finished this same house with a version of modest French details.
8. Dallas, Texas; 2008. This almost symmetrical example has Moorish details.
